

PROFESSIONAL LICENSURE INFORMATION

Prospective students who are interested in the programs of study at Fine Mortuary College that lead to professional licensure are expected to inquire with the appropriate licensing agency in their home state, prior to beginning the program in order to assure that the program is approved to provide the desired licensure.

The National Funeral Directors Association provides the contact information of each state's licensing board along with an overview of the state's licensure requirements (within the link below). This resource may not be the most up-to-date information, so it is best that the student contacts the state licensing board directly to ensure an understanding of these requirements.
